Course Descriptions

S-130/S-190/L180/S-133/S-134: Firefighting Training; Intro to Wildland Fire Behavior;

Human Factors on the Fireline; Look Up, Look Down, Look Around; LCES

Prerequisites: None

This introductory course is designed to train entry-level firefighters referred to as a Firefighter Type 2 (FFT2). You will be introduced to and gain knowledge of the basic incident management organization, firefighting techniques, suppression equipment, safety, strategy/tactics along with fire behavior. Field exercises will be performed for valuable hands-on training. Includes L-180, S-133 and S-134.

S-200 - INITIAL ATTACK INCIDENT COMMANDER

Course Description:

This course is designed to meet the training needs of the ICT4. It is presented in a

discussion/exercise format. The six instructional units cover: Foundation Skills; Intelligence Gathering and Documentation; Size Up the Incident; Develop a Plan of Action; Post-fire Activities; Evaluating Incident Objectives and Manage the Incident. Evaluation of the student is by unit tests and performance based evaluations

S-212: Wildland Fire Chain Saws

Prerequisites: Qualified as a FFT2

This is an instructor-led course intended to be presented at the local level. The course lessons provide introduction to the function, maintenance and use of internal combustion engine powered chain saws, and their tactical wildland fire application. Field exercises support entry level training for firefighters with little or no previous experience in operating a chain saw, providing hands-on cutting experience in surroundings similar to fire line situations. This course does not provide certification.

S-215: Fire Operations in the Wildland/Urban Interface

Prerequisites: Qualified FFT2

Course Descriptions

Pre-work: None

This course is designed to assist structure and wildland firefighters who will be making tactical decisions when confronting wildland fire that threatens life, property, and improvements, in the wildland/urban interface. Instructional units include interface awareness, size-up, initial strategy and incident action plan, structure triage, structure protection tactics, incident action plan assessment and update, follow-up and public relations, and firefighter safety in the interface.

S-336 - TACTICAL DECISION MAKING IN WILDLAND FIRE

Course Description:

This course is designed to meet training requirements in the Operations Section of the Incident Command System. Examples and exercises in this package are specific to wildland fire suppression.
